Michelle Van Noy is excited about a new project. To help workers enter and advance in careers, noncredit education and non-degree credentials are of increasing interest but very little data exist on either. To build capacity for future data collection efforts, this NSF-funded project will lay the groundwork for common definitional language to improve the understanding of the value and quality of noncredit programs and non-degree credentials. Working with state partners in Iowa, Louisiana, and Virginia community college systems, Rutgers Education and Employment Research Center (EERC) will analyze programlevel noncredit data to examine better understand the characteristics of noncredit programs and non-degree credentials and develop a taxonomy to guide future data collection efforts. The project will convene discussions with these three states and others to create a Learning Community dedicated to building the data infrastructure on noncredit education and non-degree credentials.

The Rutgers Institute for the Study of Employee Ownership and Profit Sharing appointed 25 research fellows to study how granting stock to employees can sustain and grow the middle class as part of our recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. The senior researchers, emerging scholars, and subject matter experts announced today represent the most globally diverse class of fellows in the 14-year history of the program. Research shows that owning a piece of the company where you work and sharing in its profits can increase productivity, reduce employee turnover, and help workers build significant wealth with a supportive corporate culture. But as the Institute documented in research commissioned by The Wall Street Journal, women and people of color do not share equally in the rewards. With these appointments, the Institute will launch a major research initiative to further study those disparities and how to fix them. Learn more about the fellows and their research topics.
