

'Speaking Out' in Residential Care

Concerns for the mistreatment of vulnerable people while in hospital or living in residential care are widespread and increasing. In the UK, recent public inquiries of institutional abuse in acute hospitals reported catastrophic failures starting at the patients' bedsides and reaching through the hierarchy of the National Health Service and into government.

Dr. Diane Burns, assistant professor of human resource management and organizational behavior at Sheffield University Management School, UK, will discuss the issue of 'cultures of silence' in nursing homes and examine the forces that inhibit staff and residents from 'speaking out' about poor care.

The implications for both researching, and organizing, residential care will be explored.
